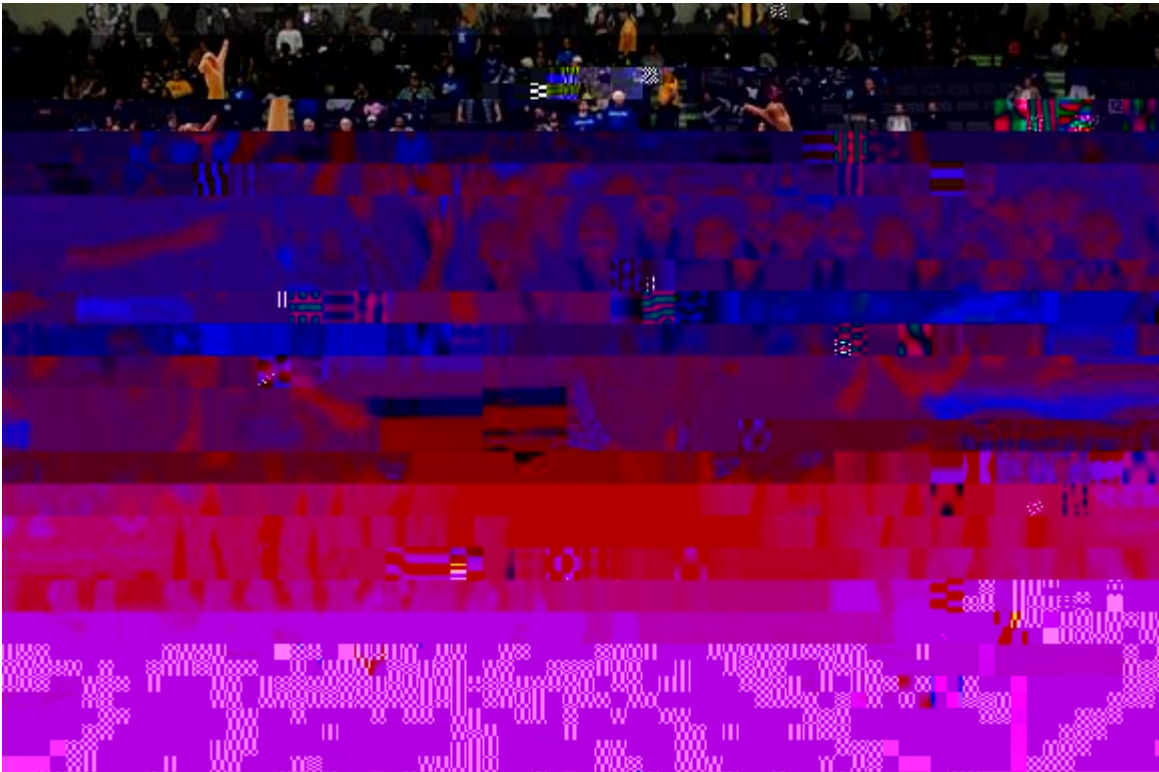

With the tournament win, GSC earned the number one seed and the honor to host the NCAA Division II Atlantic Regional Tournament at the Waco Center last week.
